Recipes from the Garden

"FRESHEN-UP" PARSLEY DOG BISCUITS

Parsley is one of the few things that are plentiful in gardens now---let it go to the dogs! These are treats for pups-and owners. Fresh doggie breathe is a possibility!

2 cups whole wheat flour, or more as needed

1 cup shredded carrots

1/4 cup shredded peeled apple

2 1/2 tablespoons honey

3 tablespoons finely chopped fresh parsley

1 cup warm water

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. In a large mixing bowl, combine the flour, carrots, apple, honey and parsley, then add the warm water. Mix thoroughly. If the dough is sticky, add more flour. Turn the dough out onto a floured board and roll into a circle 1/4 inch thick. Cut out biscuits with a **bone-shaped cookie cutter** and place on a nonstick baking sheet. Bake the biscuits for 9 to 12 minutes, depending on the size, until the edges are brown. Let cool on a rack, then pass out the biscuits ----as deserved.
