# Garden Club of Teaneck's Dawn Redwood -By Anna Kurz

To the west of our greenhouse, there is a large tree with a fluted trunk; its feathery leaves, green in summer, turn tan and then fall off in the cold. Though a conifer, it is deciduous: in winter, it is bare. Our own dawn redwood is an example of the only surviving genus of its species, *metasequoia glyptostroboides*. It was considered extinct until 1941 when living samples were found in a remote part of China. Paleontologists distinguished this tree from true redwoods by the growth pattern of new branches (opposite and decussate). As lumber, dawn redwood was considered inferior because of the deep fluting the bottom trunk exhibited. Anna
