Garden Club of Teaneck Speaks **Mushrooms: Pharma and Pariah**



GCT invites the public to learn how mushrooms, known throughout history, are sources of poison, of health and of recreation and the risky business of ingestion. Speaker Paul Sadowski will examine various cultural aspects of medicinal practices and the dangerous results of careless consumption. Paul will expand on the hallucinogenic, the gourmet, the nefarious, and the medical aspects for which humans have used mushrooms. We have procured mushrooms using varied techniques from growing them in sterile growing conditions, gathering them in the wild, to routing them out by pigs.

Sadowski, a music publisher, has been an "amateur" mycologist more than 20 years. Long active (Treasurer, Secretary) in the New York Mycological Society (along with composer John Cage) and the Northeast Mycological Federation, he frequently leads walk/talks in search of fungi (mushrooms).
