The following is information about our 58th plant sale, which we hope will be wonderful, because our plants this year are turning out to be exceptional. There is still some more group potting-up work to do, but we are shifted towards plant care and

development, with about 5 weeks remaining before our start day, May 5th.

Please be very aware of temperatures in the Greenhouse and open the top vents when inside temperatures exceed 82 degrees with the sun shining and close them in the late afternoon/evening. Check with Doug about watering assignments. There is still a lot of work remaining and nurturing our plants is now essential.

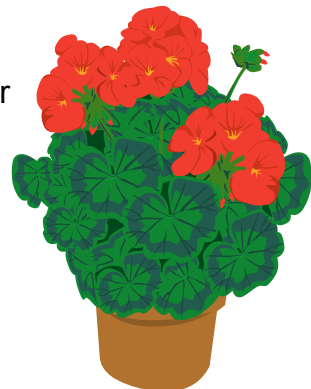
