Message from Len Schwartz, Greenhouse Director

We welcome Robin Jackson as Recording Secretary, replacing Pat Fromm. We thank you Pat.

Starting this year anyone who makes an approved purchase for the greenhouse must complete a greenhouse payment voucher which is available from Sara and at the greenhouse. Please fill out the voucher, attach your receipt and give both to Sara for reimbursement.

All members are required to be in a work group and participate in our plant sale. The proposed eight work groups this year are: Sunday AM, Sunday PM, Monday AM, Tuesday PM, Wednesday AM, Thursday AM, Thursday PM, and Friday PM. Please make sure that you belong to a group and know when it meets. We are going to return to our regular practice of requiring weekly attendance from all members. Our rules specify that up to three hours a week may be required in your work groups. The work groups will start meeting the week of Oct 20th. Our immediate task is to get our building into shape. This year the work groups will take responsibility for maintaining the cleanliness and order of the meeting room and greenhouse. A list of duties and responsibilities is being prepared, and the executive committee will be discussing how to share these equitably. It is not expected that any single group do everything on the list. It is expected that each group will identify something which needs doing and accomplish this activity during their meeting.

The 2013-2014 budget was approved with a slight increase over the previous year. Hospitality for our November second meeting

Message from Joe Papa – Horticulture Director

Our light days are diminishing as the trees accelerate the shedding of their leaves. These leaves are a great source of carbon, which could be incorporated into your composters. The ideal carbon nitrogen ratio is 25:1, when this ratio is too low the conversion to compost by the bacteria, fungi and other microorganisms is impeded. As temperatures decrease so does the composting processes. However, it is still a good time to collect, integrate and store leaves for future use. I still have kale, radicchio, Bok Choi and lettuce in the garden and I will use row covers when frost is forecasted to extend their life. We will be unearthing our Cannas, which we will prepare for over wintering and the plant sale. Joe
