GCT and Community Gardens

"To forget how to dig the earth and to tend the soil is to forget ourselves."~Mahatma Gandhi Besides the Greenhouse Gardens, there are three community gardens where people can remember how to dig the earth.

**Teaneck Community Gardens** (TCC) just to the north of the GCT Greenhouse, is administered by the Teaneck Township, which provides support for the efforts of community gardeners. TCC has 85 plots, each 16' x 15', provided by "first come first served."Some GCT members have served on the TCC Committee, some have gardens here, the GCT invites TCC to the Harvest Fest.

The Michelle Obama Interdisciplinary Outdoor Garden opened on Earth Day (April 22,2015.) The Michelle Obama program "Let's Move" inspired the start of the garden. GCT members acted as consultants early in its development. GCT members provide labor, along with other supporting groups, such as the Puffin Foundation. The Garden measures 20' x 30' and is located on the south side of TJ. Vegetables are farmed by the students. You will be welcomed by the graphic sign Bob O'Brien designed.

The newest community garden in the Teaneck area is the **Bogota is Beautiful Garden**, which opened on June 11. It is supported by Bogota, grants, and community groups. GCT members acted as consultants as the garden emerged in 2015-16. The 16 individually gardened raised bed plots are on River Road, bordered by railroad tracks. The decorated rain barrels, painted by Bogota high school students, serve to help water the vegetables in the raised beds. The first harvest is in, gardeners plan for next year. ---Pat Libutti, Editor
