Message from Christina Mackensen, Greenhouse Horticultural Director:

All members are to bring only clean and healthy outdoor and houseplants back into the greenhouse for over-wintering. All plants should be free of pests. The tops and undersides of leaves should be inspected for any pests that might be present. A light infestation can be removed with a forceful spray of lukewarm water. Another method is to wash the leaves and stems with a soft cotton cloth that has been dipped into a mild detergent solution (1/2 teaspoon per one quart of lukewarm water). Applying the two methods recommended will assure that we will start our greenhouse season with healthy plants. Now that the greenhouse has been thoroughly cleaned, we want to keep it that way.
