#### Message from Len Schwartz, Greenhouse Director

We left the greenhouse sealed for the summer in order to kill off our resident community of white flies and hopefully any other unwanted bugs as well. During the hot summer days the temperature inside the greenhouse exceeded 150 degrees which should have accomplished

our goal. Now we have to be diligent about not re-infesting the greenhouse. The executive board will meet on Sept. 19 to develop our maintenance plan but until this is functioning, no plants or contaminated material may be brought into the greenhouse, please.

Our gardens this year looked considerably better than they did last season, when weeds dominated and much of the vegetable crop was harvested by deer. We all know that maintaining a garden involves a lot of work and continued attention. Next year we should consider the allocation of some smaller plots for members who could do better with less space, as well as, keep high expectation levels for all of our gardens.

It is time to start spending our reserve fund on greenhouse improvements. We need to establish our goals, and to set up short and long term plans to meet them. Our future budgets should reflect our future as well as our current needs.

### **Native Plant Program Update**

Jointly with the Bergen County Audubon Society (BCAS), we planted next to the greenhouse some 300 native plants of elderberry, button bush, and viburnum for habitat restoration lost through development. BCAS has taken plants intermittently over the summer and transplanted them permanently in various parks, thus providing an oasis for migratory birds. ## Last Word

In August, 1952 the following happened:

The Teaneck Garden Club voted unanimously in favor of using the abandoned sewage disposal plant on Lindbergh Boulevard as a greenhouse. Club members are expected to meet with manager James Welch to discuss the project.
